**MEDITATION:** The very word 'Eucharist' comes from a Greek word (*eucharistia*) which means *thanksgiving.* How often do we really come to the Eucharist in this frame of mind? How often do we drag ourselves reluctantly to another 'boring experience' which, as Catholics, we are told we have to attend under pain of serious sin? The Eucharist is also a time for *reconciliation*. Let's face it, we – every single one of us – and that includes the priest on the altar, approach the Eucharist as sinners. The theme of reconciliation goes right through the Mass. It appears at the beginning in the penitential rite with a public profession of our sinfulness. As the time for communion approaches, we say the Lord's Prayer and, among other things, ask to be forgiven. Before we share in the Body and Blood of the Lord, we are asked to wish peace and reconciliation to all around us. Last of all, just as we are about to approach the altar, each of us acknowledges our unworthiness saying that we are not worthy. At the heart of the Eucharist, of course, is the bread and wine. "Take and eat...this is my body" is an invitation to eat that Body of Christ of which we too are members. Thus, eating means total union with one another! When the Eucharist is dull and boring, it is not the Eucharist which is at fault, but we who come together to "celebrate" it. Without the Eucharist, all Christian living dies and without Christian living, the Eucharist dies.
