LENT: The season of Lent begins on Wednesday, 5th March. All through Lent, there will be Stations of the Cross in our Church. *Dartmouth*: *On Thursdays* - Mass at 10.00am followed by Stations. *Brixham*: *On Fridays* after the Mass.

MEDITATION: The Gospel passage contains four commands of Jesus: *love*, *forgive*, **good**, and **pray**. They specify the kind of love that the Christian follower is expected to show toward an enemy. The "enemy" is one who injures hates or rejects the Christian. What makes Christians different and what makes Christianity distinct from any other religion? It is grace - treating others, not as they deserve, but as God wishes them to be treated - with loving-kindness and mercy. God is good to the unjust as well as the just. His love embraces saint and sinner alike. God seeks our highest good and teaches us to seek the greatest good of others, even those who hate and abuse us. Our love for others, even those who are ungrateful and selfish towards us, must be marked by the same kindness and mercy which God has shown to us. It is easier to show kindness and mercy when we can expect to benefit from doing so. How much harder when we can expect nothing in return. With God all things are possible. He gives power and grace to those who believe in the Lord Jesus and accept the gift of the Holy Spirit. His love conquers all, even our hurts, fears, prejudices and griefs. Only the cross of Jesus Christ can free us from the tyranny of malice, hatred, revenge, and resentment and gives us the courage to return evil with good. Such love and grace has power to heal and to save from destruction. That is why Paul the Apostle tells those who know the love and mercy of Jesus Christ to "bless and not curse... nor take revenge. and to overcome evil with good" (Romans 12:14,17,21).
